



Pre-req/Prerequisite A course that needs to be completed before another specific course (usually an upper division course) can be taken.

Withdraw From a Course To remove a course from your schedule after you have attended it. Withdrawn courses appear on your transcript with a "grade" of W but do not impact your grade point average (GPA). To withdraw from a course, you must complete the Course Add/Drop/Withdrawal form found in the Student Portal.

CLW/CHAPEL OVERVIEW

The Community Life + Worship (CLW) program at Rochester University exists in our community through chapel programming, campus ministry programs, diversity initiatives, service-learning opportunities and more. Each of these experiences helps lead to faith formation among students.

Chapel is the dedicated time where the campus community gathers together for worship, teaching and ministry-driven programming. Campus ministry initiatives focus on developing programs and learning opportunities that nurture spiritual growth for students.

Service Learning efforts integrate meaningful community service and reflection to enrich the RU learning experience, teach civic responsibility and strengthen communities. These collective efforts are aimed at building community in a diverse world, affirming Christian values and instilling a greater sense of vocation.



COMMUNITY life + worship

Participation in the Community Life + Worship program is a requirement for graduation.

Refer to the Student Handbook for a complete description

All traditional (full & part-time) students seeking an undergraduate degree must complete the 175 CLW credit requirement before graduation. A minimum of 90 CLW credits must be earned through attendance at campus-wide chapel. Students are highly encouraged to acquire a minimum of 25 credits per semester (for seven semesters). Students may earn as many CLW credits per semester as their schedule allows until the full requirement is met before graduation. Approximately 40 CLW credits can be earned in campus-wide chapel in any given semester. Transfer students will automatically receive CLW credits towards the requirement of 175 CLW credits. The following chart outlines the number of points a transfer student will be required to complete based on their transfer status.

Current Transfer Status	Number of Credits to Complete for Graduation	Number of CLW Credits required to be earned by Campus-Wide Chapels
30-59 Credits earned (Sophomore Status)	125	65
60-89 Credits earned (Junior Status)	75	40
90 or more Credits earned (Senior Status)	25	12



iAttended

CSL uses the iAttended App for Chapel/CLW attendance. At the beginning of each Chapel, a QR code will be made available to scan. As you enter and before you exit, scan the QR code using the app, and your attendance will be recorded and updated in real-time. Each code is unique with a time limit, and every scan is timestamped. All CLW credits can be seen under the progress tab.

Before the semester starts, complete the following steps:

- 1. Download iAttended on your smartphone.
- 2. Open the app; enter your Rochester University email address.
- 3. Choose "send activation link."
- 4. Follow prompts sent to your RU email address.


